Admission to Nursery at Damson Wood Nursery & Infant School Academy (2026-27)

Damson Wood Infant and Nursery School is responsible for managing admissions for their Nursery intake. Should your child be 3 years old by 31st August 2026, they are eligible to start our Nursery. If you would like to apply for a September 2026 place, you must apply directly through Damson Wood Nursery & Infant School.

We try our best to meet parents' request, however, sometimes there may be more applications for a particular intake than there are places. If this happens we will use the oversubscription criteria to decide who is offered a place.

Oversubscription criteria

- Priority 1 Looked after children or children who were looked after but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order).
- Priority 2 Children living in the catchment area of the school (catchment areas can be seen on the council's online maps link)
- Priority 3 Children who will have an older brother or sister attending the school at the same time. (See note 3 for definition of a sibling)
- Priority 4 Children of staff who are permanently employed at Damson Wood Nursery and Infant School at the time of application
- Priority 5 Children attending Woodies Childcare at the time of application
- Priority 6 Children living outside the catchment area based on their distance from home to school measured using the council's online maps.

Outcome

Parents will be notified by email of the outcome of their application w/c 19th January, 2026.

Accepting your place

Parents will have to accept the place within 2 weeks (by w/c 9th February 2026) of the offer in writing or email. Places that have not been accepted will be offered to the next child on the list.

Notes

Attendance at the nursery will not guarantee admission to our Reception class – see our school Admission Arrangements for further details: <http://www.damson-wood.co.uk/admissions/>. Parents must apply for a Reception place through their home local authority.

1. Children with an education, health and care plan that names the nursery will be offered a place. This may reduce the number of places available to other applicants.
2. Definition of a sibling:
A brother or sister must live at the same address and could be:
 - A brother or sister sharing the same parents;
 - a half-brother or half-sister, where two children share one parent;
 - a stepbrother or stepsister, where two children are related by a parent's marriage or civil partnership (a formal arrangement that gives same-sex couples the same legal status as married couples);
 - the separate children of couples who live together; or
 - an adopted or fostered brother or sister.
3. The home address is the place where the child is permanently resident with his or her parents. When a child lives between two addresses we will use the address of the parent who is in receipt of Child Benefit.
4. If we cannot distinguish between two applicants because the criterion and distance is the same, for example, children in the same block of flats then the child or children who will be offered will be randomly selected by drawing lots.
5. Unsuccessful applicants will be placed on a waiting list in priority order according to the oversubscription criteria. If a place becomes available the child at the top of the list will be offered the place.
6. There is no statutory right of appeal for admission to a nursery setting. Any disputes over the administration of the policy will be dealt with by the school's complaints procedure.
